

Delaware State Representative Joseph Miro is a Wilmington High School graduate and has earned a Master's degree from West Chester University.

Representative Miro has been a State Representative since 1998. Prior to being elected for Delaware's House of Representatives, he served 6 years as a County Councilman for the New Castle County in Northern Delaware. He is a retired educator after serving 31 years in Delaware's school system and also served as the president and consultant for Miro Diversified Accounts.

Representative Miro has served on numerous boards including National Hispanic Council for State Legislators where he has served as the National Vice President from 2005 to 2007, the National President from 2007 to 2009 and is currently serving as a chair of the International Trades Task Force and a member of the executive board; Council of State Governments; National Conference of State Legislatures where he presently serves as a member of the Immigration Task Force; National Education Association and a former member of the National State Energy Advisory Board. Most recently, he was appointed by Governor Markell to Southern Regional Education Board. As a State Representative, Rep. Miro sits on the Capital Infrastructure, Education and Health and Human Development committees, as well as one of the state's budgetary committees, Capital Improvement.
